## Value for money



## Funding opportunities



- **EU funded programmes**
  - **Erasmus+ offers** funding for 3-12 month exchanges and study abroad opportunities for international students as part of their study programme. You can also do a traineeship instead of – or alongside – your studies. Contact the International Relations office of your home university to get more information!
  - **Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees (EMJMDs)** are international study programmes for one or two years delivered jointly by several European higher education institutions. ### FIND AN INSTITUTION AND A STUDY PROGRAMME

Define what you are looking for and start gathering information. Look for possible host institutions, their programmes and admissions requirements. The national information portal of your preferred country has useful information on study programmes and higher education institutions.

- the country where you want to study

### APPLY

Review your choices, qualifications and possible funding opportunities and make a final selection. Apply in time and don't forget to supply all the required documents and details!

### PREPARE YOUR TRIP

If you are admitted and you accept the offer, you'll now have to start preparing for your stay by arranging your visa, funding, insurance and accommodation.
